

Horsetooth

We continue to have an issue with the 145.115 repeater. At first I thought it was a hardware failure, but I am leaning towards an intermod/interference issue. Since we have a camera inside the Horsetooth shack, I can see some LED indicators on the repeaters which has led me to believe the hardware is actually OK and the issue is with an offending signal. The site has been under some decent snow for a while and every time it seems the road is probably OK, it snows again! A trip will be made as soon as possible to check into this and see what we can do. In the meantime, please continue to report any outage via the techfeedback email address and we'll do our best to keep it on the air!

Buckhorn

A PTZ (pan-tilt-zoom) camera was recently installed at Buckhorn. This camera will not only help us watch the site for security, but along with the PTZ at Horsetooth, will allow us to watch for advancing wildfire and help report that to Poudre Valley REA, other site tenants, and help us plan better for potential outages. I've included a few shots from our various mountain top cameras.

Phone Patch Project

I was close to having the entire phone patch system working to add that capability to our repeaters, then, the server hosting the PBX suffered a catastrophic failure and none of my configuration was able to be saved. I spent a few weeks rebuilding things (and verifying backups are working) and am almost back to that point again.

I am struggling through a few more hiccups with the new PBX system, and then I can drop the repeater configuration back on. If you hear any testing on the repeaters, it's me, and it means we are close! I'll send a club announcement, once this is functioning, with instructions.

The board approved a small expenditure to purchase the necessary parts to finish building a MUCH larger battery bank at the Rattlesnake site. We are experiencing a power deficit in as little as 2 days with the solar panels covered in snow and were expecting 5 or more days. Thanks to a very generous donation of LiFePO4 batteries to the Club, we have the ability to take the battery bank at Rattlesnake from 200 amp hours, to 560 amp hours! The parts purchased will allow us to safely charge and maintain the proper temperature of the batteries which will be stored in an insulated box.

Still hoping for a spring install of the gear to get Grover connected to Sterling to complete that section of the project. I am still working on Red Feather exploration as well. No shortage of projects for us!

This spring, I'd also like to get a volunteer group together to paint and clean up our Horsetooth shelter.

That's all for this month! Stay warm and enjoy those nice days we have between snowstorms!
